J. Armand Bombardier Community Service Learning Awards

INTRODUCTION

The J. Armand Bombardier Foundation was established in 1965 to carry on the humanitarian work of Joseph-Armand Bombardier and to contribute to the Bombardier Corporation's vision of social responsibility. The Foundation has made substantial contributions in the areas of education, community support, healthcare as well as arts and culture. Culturally, the Foundation also plays a very important role through the J. Armand Bombardier Museum and the Yvonne L. Bombardier Cultural Centre, both located in Valcourt, Quebec.

PURPOSE OF FUND

To finance awards in the amount of \$2,000 to defray travel costs of students registered in an undergraduate program at the University of Ottawa.

SCHOLARSHIP DETAILS

Eligibility Criteria:

The applicant must:

1. Be registered in an undergraduate program at the University of Ottawa.
2. Be registered to the Experiential Learning Service of the Student Academic Success Service.
3. Be in good academic standing.
4. Be involved in the community as a volunteer and show leadership by fostering community building on the local, national and/or international stage.

Value of the Award:	\$ 2000
Number of Awards:	8 for the first two years; 4 for the third year
Frequency of the Award:	Annual, from 2009-2010 to 2011-2012 inclusively
Level of the Award:	Undergraduate

Application Deadline:	February 28 or October 31, as determined each year by the Financial Aid and Awards Service

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

Application must be made to the Director of Financial Aid and Awards Service and should include:

1. A scholarship application form available at the Financial Aid and Awards Service or online at www.uottawa.ca/loansandawards.
2. A copy of the applicant's academic transcript.
3. A one-page written statement describing a) the candidate's community involvement both at the University of Ottawa and in the wider community and b) the role these activities have played in the development of the candidate's own personal ethics and in his or her academic and professional development.
